**Customer information on Regulation (EG) No. 1907/2006
Information obligation according to Article 33 of the European Union on Chemicals (REACH)**

müller co-ax gmbh is a manufacturer of articles within the meaning of the REACH Regulation (e.g. directly and indirectly operated 2/2- and 3/2-way coaxial valves, lateral valves, control valves, high-pressure valves, special valves, explosion-proof and type-tested valves, cartridge valves, modules and manifolds).

With regard to the substances and mixtures used in our processes, we are also considered a downstream user.

For our articles, there is generally no registration obligation under REACH, provided that no intentional release of substances occurs. Any registration obligation for substances contained in our articles lies with our respective upstream suppliers.

In accordance with Article 33 of the REACH Regulation, we are obliged to inform our customers if our articles contain substances of very high concern (SVHC) included in the Candidate List in a concentration above 0.1% by mass (with reference to the respective article).

We hereby inform you that our products may contain components made of copper alloys, in particular brass, which contain lead (EC No. 231-100-4, CAS No. 7439-92-1) in a concentration above 0.1% by mass. Typical affected components include, for example, valve bodies, connection fittings and internal metallic parts.

The lead is firmly bound within the metal matrix as an alloying element. Under normal and intended conditions of use, no exposure to humans or the environment is expected.


As part of our due diligence obligations, we maintain close communication with our suppliers regarding compliance with REACH requirements. The substances and mixtures used by us (e.g. lubricants, adhesives, paints and coatings) are registered in accordance with legal requirements.

Where required, relevant information on articles containing SVHC is also submitted to the SCIP database of the European Chemicals Agency in accordance with applicable regulations.

Due to the large number of inquiries, we kindly ask for your understanding that we are unable to provide individual substance assessments for specific products.
